FARNSWORTH PUBLIC LIBRARY POLICY FOR CHILDREN

Farnsworth Public Library welcomes children of all ages to use its facilities, materials and services. In an effort to ensure the safety and well-being of children and maintain an atmosphere of constructive library use, the following policy, regarding appropriate use of the Library by children and their caregivers, has been adopted.

Responsibility for the welfare and the behavior of children using the Library rests with the parent/guardian. Although staff will respond with care and concern, they cannot assume responsibility for children's safety and comfort.

Children under the age of 9 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times.

All other children may use the Library unattended, provided they follow the Farnsworth Public Library Code of Conduct.

Parents are responsible for the actions of their children, at the Library, whether they are supervised or unsupervised. In the event children over the age of nine are behaving inappropriately or violating the Code of Conduct at the Library, they may be asked to leave.

The Library staff reserves the right to call the police in the event of a problem.

Parents/guardians are responsible for noting Library hours and making arrangements for children to be picked up before the Library closes.
